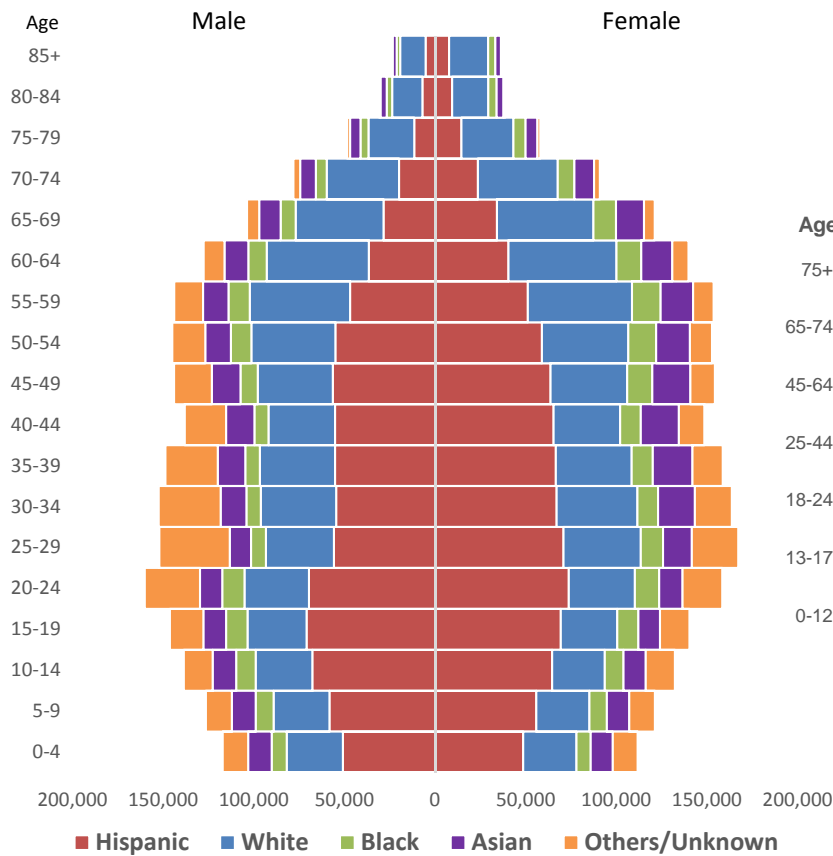
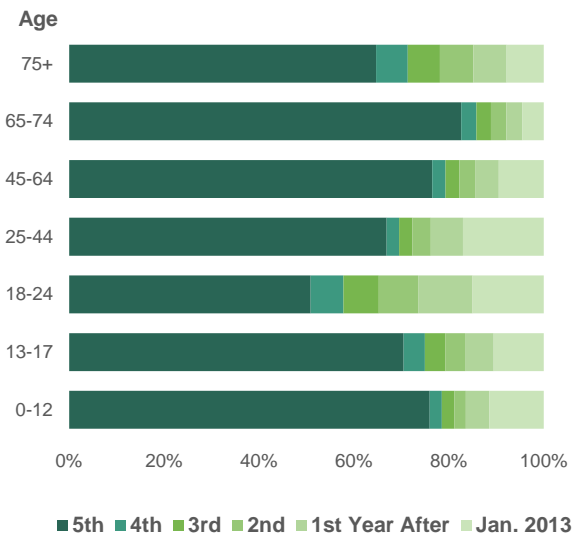


Kaiser Permanente Southern California Member Population Overview

Kaiser Permanente Southern California serves over 4.3 million members as of the beginning of 2018, including 49% males and 51% female. The diverse member population consists of approximately 43% Hispanic, 34% non-Hispanic White, 12% Asian, 9% African American, and 2% others among the over 90% of members with reported race and ethnicity information.

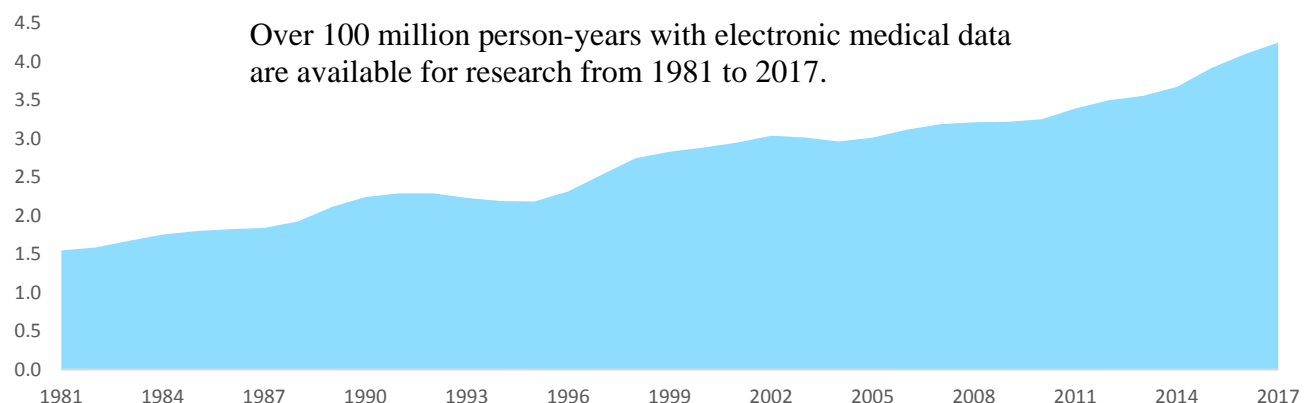


The overall 1-to-5-year retention rates are 88%, 82%, 78%, 74%, and 71% from 2013 to 2018.
