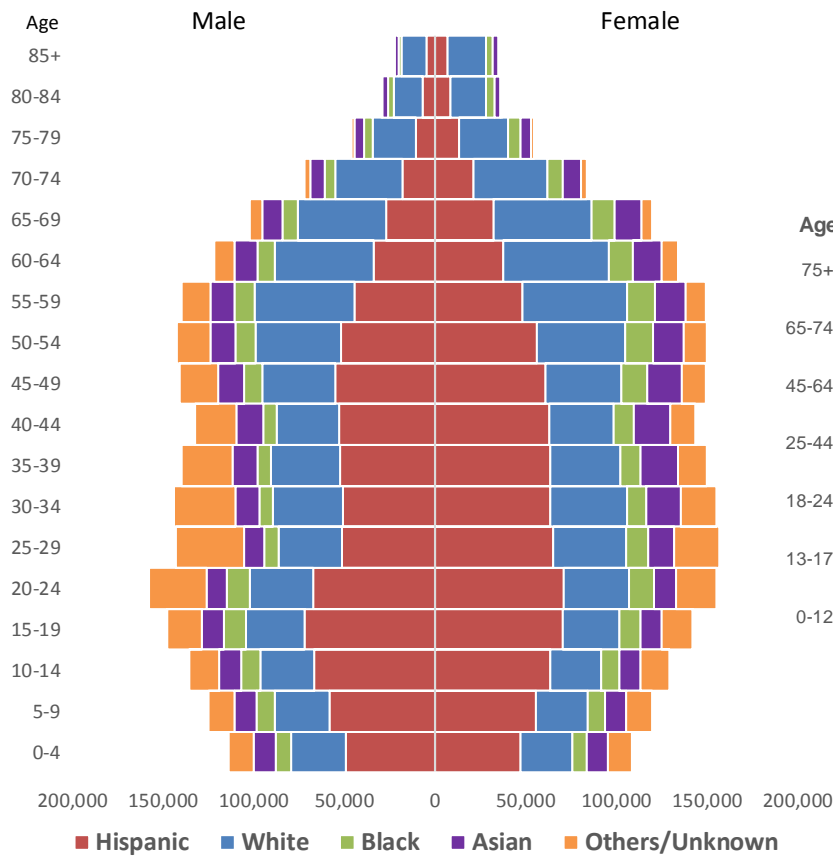
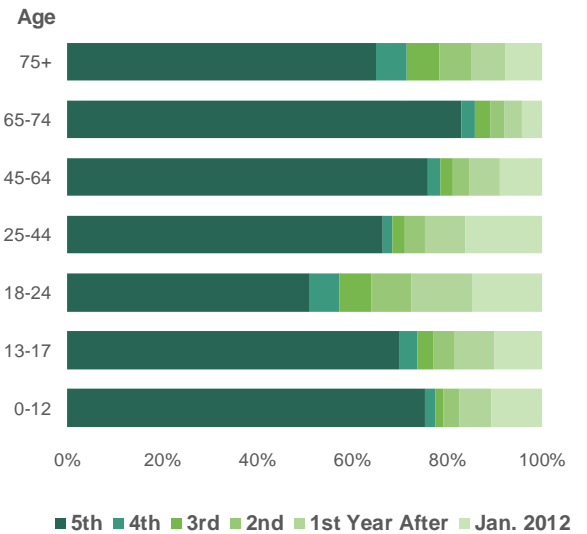


Kaiser Permanente Southern California Member Population Overview

Kaiser Permanente Southern California serves over 4.2 million members as of the beginning of 2017, including 49% males and 51% female. The diverse member population consists of approximately 43% Hispanic, 35% non-Hispanic white, 9% African American, 11% Asian, and 2% others among the over 90% of members with reported race and ethnicity information.

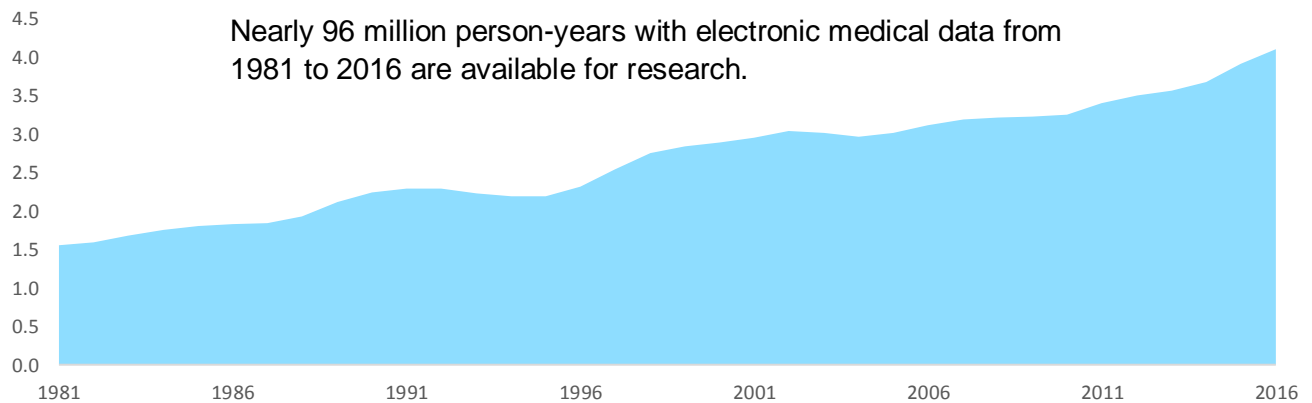


The overall 1- to 5-year retention rates are 89%, 81%, 77%, 74%, and 70% from 2012 to 2017.
