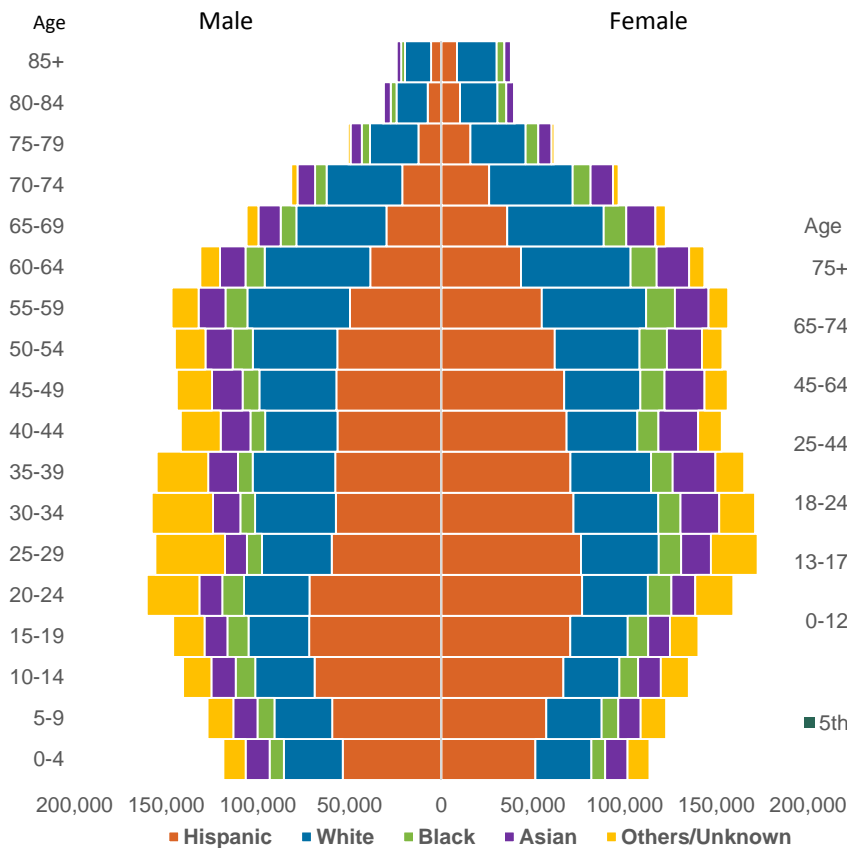
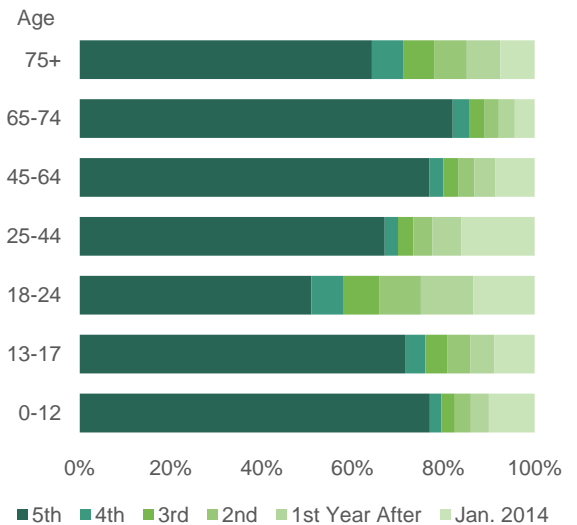


Kaiser Permanente Southern California Member Population Overview

Kaiser Permanente Southern California (KPSC) serves 4.5 million members in the beginning of 2019, including 49% males and 51% female. The diverse member population consists of approximately 43% Hispanic, 34% non-Hispanic White, 12% Asian, 8% African American, and 3% others among the over 91% of members with reported race and ethnicity information.

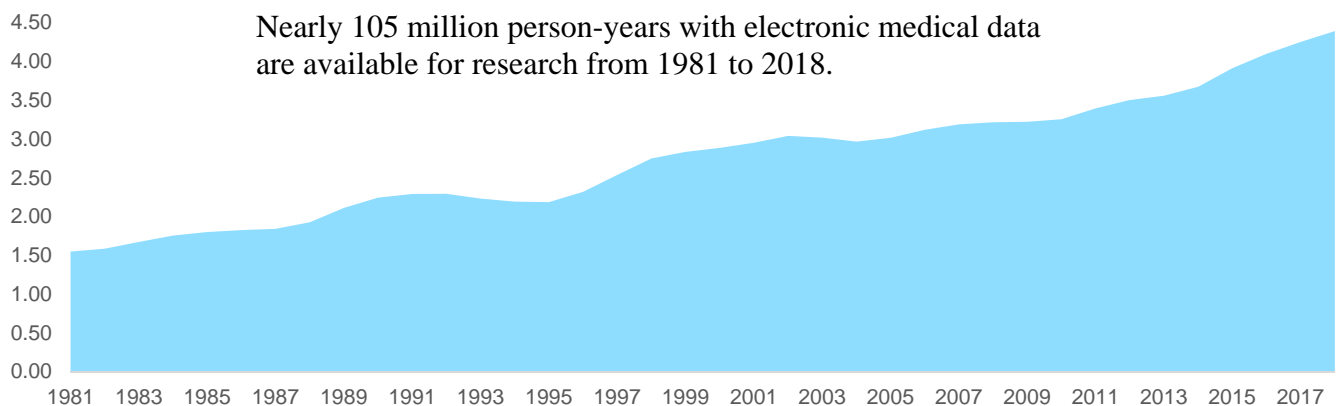


The overall one to five year retention rates are 89%, 83%, 79%, 75%, and 71% from 2014 to 2019.

There were over 40 thousand babies born annually in KPSC hospitals in recent years. More than half of the babies were born by Hispanic mothers in the past two decades.
